What's Happening with Clarity Kids this Month?

Discipleship Ideas for Home

- Our "Big Question" this month is "What is worship?" Worship is celebrating the greatness of God. Most of the time we think of worship as singing, but worship is not the actual act itself but the intent behind it. Worship is celebrating the greatness of God, whether that be through song, dance, prayer, service, giving, art, or sacrifice. There are so many ways to celebrate who God is. Think of a unique way to worship God with your children this month!
- Choose one of the Bible stories from this month's Sunday school lessons, or pick one from your family devotions time/etc. Read it together as a family and discuss how it shows us more about who God is. Practice relating the story to the Gospel. (Question #2 of the SQuestions)
- Pick a moment in your day that is not particularly intentional or meaningful but one in which you are already doing something (like taking the kids to school) & swap it with a very focused moment of intentionality. You could pray with your kids, ask them questions, let them ask you questions, tell them a story, whatever! Use those bits of time more intentionally to build relationship & allow for connection.
